While studying in the United States, it is important to maintain your F-1 student status. Your status relates to the purpose or reason for why you want to come to the United States. The U.SDepartment of State issues youyour visa based on your intended purpose.

If the Department of State issues you an FI student visa, this means that you are coming to the United States to study. You should not take any action that detracts from that purpose. Maintaining your status means:

- x Fulfilling the purpose for why the Department of Statessued you your visa; and
- x Following the regulations associated with that purpose.

Below are actions to take in order to properly maintain your status.

Arrival

When arriving to the United StatesF-1 students must:

- x Enter the United Statesno more than 30 days before your program of study begins.
- x Immediately contact yourdesignated school official (DSO) when you enter the United States.
- x When you arrive at school, you neet b report to school by the orientation date listed on your admission letter.

Education

While studying in the United States F-1 students must:

- x Attend and pass all your classes. If you have academic of financial difficultiestalk to your DSO immediately about your options.
- x You must take afull course of study each term (12 hrs for undergraduate and 9 hours for graduate); if you cannot study full-time, contact your DSO immediately. Please realize that you may be told to leave the U.S. Students of has are required to study full-time each semester.
- x If you do not enroll, you will not be allowed to remain in the U.S. on your F -1 visa.
- x If you believe that you will be unable to complete your program by the end date listed on your DSO about

Work and Practical Training for F Students

An F-1 student may only work when authorized by a DSO OPT and CPT) in some cases, and S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) in others. OPT and CPT are only available once you are enrolled in a degree program? It is available only at the completion of a degree program and only once at each level of completion. CPT is available after a feathr of academic enrollmentOPT and CPT employment must be related to your major area of studyOn campus employment is available to-IF students, but only ifyou are enrolled in a degree program (undergraduate or graduate). If you choose to work without authorization from your DSO and/or USCIS, you will be violation of your visa statusand you maynot be able to reenter the United States at a later date.

Upon Program Completion

As an F1 student, youmust take action to maintain legal status or depart the United States after completing ur program of study.

Once you complete your program of study and any authorized period of practical training, F-1 students have 60 days after completion of your program (the program end date on your Form I -20) to leave the United States.
